NARRATIVE:

On 4/2/18 at approximately 12:45 a.m., I was dispatched to 222 Saks Ave., Jackson, MS for a burglary in progress. Dispatch stated that a neighbor, identified as Billy Bob Jones of 224 Saks Ave, Jackson, MS, called in and stated that he saw two people crawling out of his neighbor's side window with what looked like backpacks. They headed north on Saks Ave. Mr. Jones described the two suspects as medium built, believed to be male, wearing dark pants, dark shirts and dark colored baseball caps. Both suspects were carrying what appeared to be dark colored backpacks and had flashlights.

Units 999 and 888 were also dispatched to the call.

Upon arrival I went to the front door of 222 Saks Ave. and knocked on the door. No one answered. I knocked again and announced that I was with the Police Department. After a moment the porch light came on and the door was slowly opened. I observed a young white adult male wearing pajamas in the doorway. When he saw me, he visibly relaxed and said that he was glad to see me because there had just been someone inside his house. I asked him if he was the owner of the home. He said that his name was Marvin Smith and that he in fact was the owner of the home. I informed Mr. Smith that we had received a call of a possible burglary in progress. I asked Mr. Smith if he wanted me to check the house and make sure no one else was inside. He gave permission and said that his wife was in the bedroom. I swept the house and brought Mrs. Smith outside. No other intruders were found. I asked Mr. Smith to tell me what happened. Mr. Smith said that he and his wife were in the bedroom at the back of the house. They had gone to bed around 10:00 p.m. and were asleep. Mr. Smith stated that his wife woke him up and told him that she heard voices and asked him if he had left the TV on. He responded

that he hadn't and for her to go back to sleep. A minute or so later Mr. Smith heard something bump and then low voices. He stated that it sounded like someone may have been in the living room or office. He told his wife to stay put, then got out of bed and walked quietly in the dark to the hallway. He went down the hall and peaked around the corner and saw two boys in the living room. One of the boys turned toward Mr. Smith, saw him and then said to the other boy " K get out the window now. I saw somebody." The boys rushed to the window tossed some backpacks out, then climbed out. Mr. Smith stated that when he thought they were gone, he slowly walked through the house in the dark to make sure no one else was inside. Then he went back to the bedroom to check on his wife and let her know what was going on. Mr. Smith stated that about the time he picked up the phone to call the police, he heard knocking on the door. He stated that he was hesitant to open the door, but then heard the police identification and decided to open the door.

Mr. Smith described the persons he saw inside his house as two young Asian males with light skin, medium build, approximately 5 ft., 5 in. tall, weighing approximately 140 -150 lbs. They were wearing dark colored pants, dark t-shirts and dark baseball caps. Both males had dark colored bags and lights.

As I was taking the above statement from Mr. Smith, Unit 999 arrived on scene. Officer Hammock asked to speak with me. We stepped a few feet away from the Smiths and Officer Hammock informed me that he had picked up a young Asian male who matched the description given by dispatch of the persons seen coming out of the house. Officer Hammock said that he would like to see if Mr. Smith could identify the suspect in the backseat of his vehicle as one of the people who had been in his house.

Officer Hammock and I approached Mr. Smith and asked him if he would be willing to look at someone and tell us if he was the person he saw in his house. Mr. Smith agreed and walked with us over to the police car. Officer Hammock went around to the driver's side and rolled down the rear passenger window. I shined my flashlight inside the backseat of Officer Hammock's unit on the suspect. Mr. Smith looked at the suspect, hesitated a moment and then said that the person in the back of the car was one of the boys that was inside his house earlier.

Mr. Smith was asked to do a walk-through of his home to determine if anything was missing. Mr. Smith complied and returned a few minutes later and stated that several items were missing.

I informed Mr. Smith that a detective would be assigned to the case and the detective would need the list of all items taken from his home as soon as possible.
